RULES

RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL BE FOLLOWED

TABLE SHOOT MATCHES, range distance is 35 yards. Eight (8) tables will be provided. All shooting will be from the sitting position on a bucket or chair. No kneeling at the tables. You **must sit** at the table.

CHUNK GUN MATCHES, range distance is 60 yards. You have the option of laying on the ground shooting from a rest (log) or at the sitting position using a chair or bucket. No kneeling at the table.

Rifles are to be traditional type American firearms, either flint or percussion ignition. Open iron sights and patched round ball only. No adjustable open sights allowed – unless they have been taped over and essentially “non-adjustable” throughout the shoot. Shaders permitted. **No in lines, sealed ignition, no false muzzles allowed.**

Shooting Position for Table Shooting: All shooters will use a common table or tables and seat provided by the range (Raccoon Valley Muzzleloaders). The seats will have a maximum height of 18 inches and the club will provide chairs and/or buckets to sit on. (Note: Any person in a wheel chair may use wheel chair for shooting sit.) The muzzle of the rifle will be supported by a pyramid of 2X4's provided by the range. The rest may be covered by no more than 2 layers of cloth or leather to protect the finish of the rifle barrel. No double rest. No artificial rest such as sand bags or other supports will be allowed. The rear portion of the rifle must be supported by the shooter. The shooter **cannot** use blocks, sand bags, or other devices intended to stabilize the rifle. The shooter may rest his or her shooting arm/elbow on the shooting table for support. The other hand may be placed on the rifle or on the other arm. **The shooter must be seated at the table and kneeling will not be allowed.**

Chunk Gun Shooting: You may use a log as a rest or bring your own “chunk”. Bring your own tarp or pad to lie on. Sand bags, padding may be used. Chunks will be furnished if needed. Because of limited ability to get up and down from the ground you have the option of using table rest. All rules must be followed same as for table shooting if using table.

You are to post your own target and then pull the target and give to range officer to be scored. Each target is a one-shot target and you are given 10 targets when registering. Everyone will post targets at the same time and relay will last until everyone has fired. There will be a first-place winner in each relay. All targets are scored from the center of the X to the center of the shot hole. Shortest measure is winner. (Any shot fired outside target ring is scored as 2 inches.) All 10 targets are combined to make aggregate and there will be a first, second, third place medal for overall winner in each class.
